



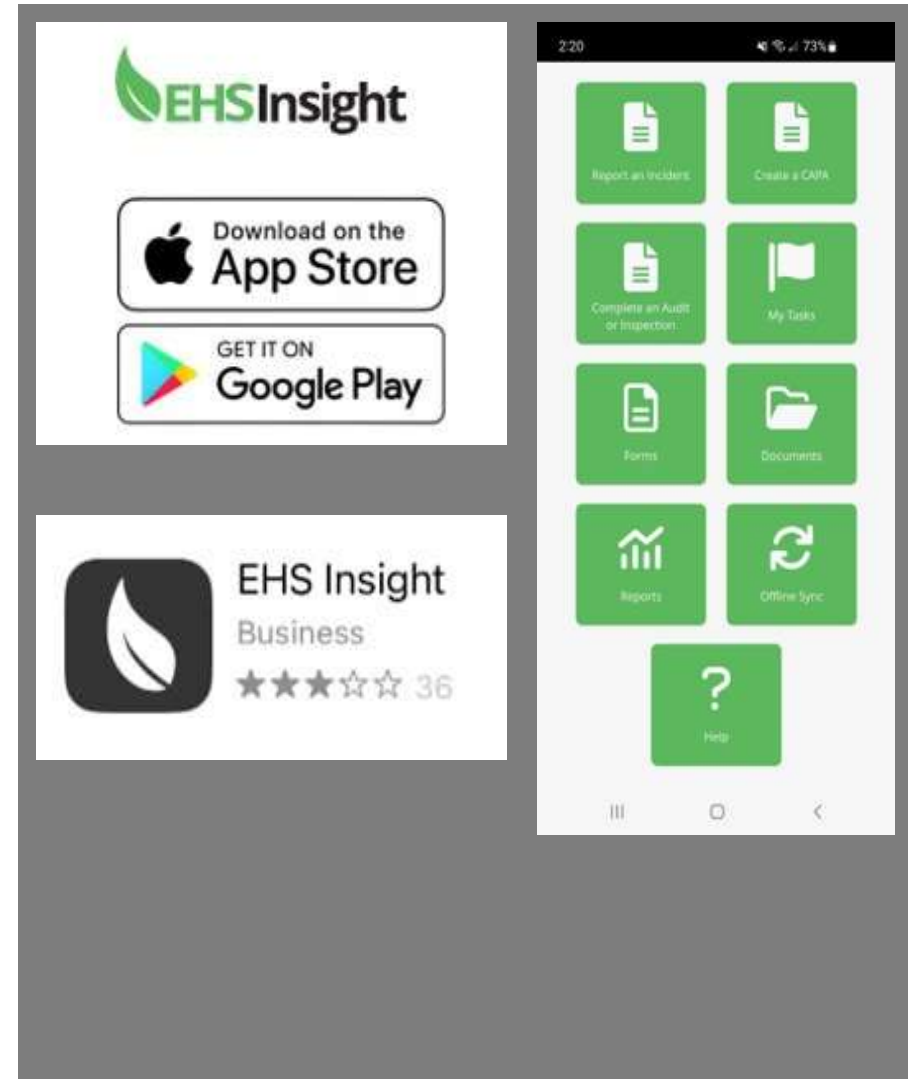

HOME FIRE ESCAPE PLANNING AND PRACTICING

It is important for everyone to plan and practice a home fire escape. Everyone needs to be prepared in advance, so that they know what to do when the smoke alarm sounds. Given that every home is different, every home fire escape plan will also be different.

Have a plan for everyone in the home. Children, older adults, and people with disabilities may need assistance to wake up and get out. Make sure that someone will help them! Smoke alarms

Smoke alarms sense smoke well before you can, alerting you to danger. Smoke alarms need to be in every bedroom, outside of the sleeping areas (like a hallway), and on each level (including the basement) of your home. Do not put smoke alarms in your kitchen or bathrooms.

Choose an alarm that is listed with a testing laboratory, meaning it has met certain standards for protection.

For the best protection, use combination smoke and carbon monoxide alarms that are interconnected throughout the home. These can be installed by a qualified electrician, so that when one sounds, they all sound. This ensures you can hear the alarm no matter where in your home the alarm originates.

Incident Learning Summary

Near Miss – H2S Monitor Alarm

Technician's H2S monitor alarmed at 52ppm, technician was good, and released back to work.

Key Points Performed Correctly

- ✓ Reported incident
- ✓ Timely reporting

Room for Improvement

- ✗ None Technician followed procedure

Asset – Truck ran over blown tire

While driving down the street, the vehicle ran over road debris (tire) causing damage to the underside of the vehicle. Vehicle was safely pulled over and reported the incident.

Key Points Performed Correctly

- ✓ Reported incident
- ✓ Timely reporting

Room for Improvement

- ✗ None Technician followed procedure

Injury – Twist of Knee

Stepped over piping to reach a component to monitor, caused technician to lose balance and twisted their knee

Key Points Performed Correctly

- ✓ Reported incident
- ✓ Timely reporting

Room for Improvement

- ✗ Use of extension probe
- ✗ Body position
